My dear Emma.

Most hearty congratu-

University reopens.

We are here, in the far north
of Scotland, for a month, in
the midst of hills and heather.

I am doing no work, but
find it difficult to get
through the days without any.

We walk & bicycle a good
deal & try to lay in a
stock of fresh air for the
London winter.

I am reading Ed. Meyer's
Gesch. d. Altertums II.

I am surprised to find him
still very little known
here. Every body reads
Ad. Holm's Greek History
& I have lately done so;
but find it very inferior
stuff to Meyer; although
being no Fachmann, I can
not judge.

What do you think of the
Dreyfus case? Was there

ever such a crew of scoundrels
as these Generals! It seems
however a great pity that
Germany ~~can~~ ^{does} not publish
the evidence, which she
apparently possesses, of
D.'s innocence. The affair
has caused the greatest
excitement all through
England, — so much
indeed, that I fear Dreyfus
must have suffered by it.
