My dear Edman.

at any rate. If you were
here in the 1st week, I should
probably see you; if later,
I should not; and when I
returned, you ~~to~~ would have
left. Do let me know,
then, when you think of coming.
I shall try to arrange my
journey so as to see you. I
should be very sorry to think
you had been in London & not

to have seen you. I
presume that Fran Boman is
not coming with you?

I hope Brewster will get all he
wants at the Museum. I
understand that Budge has
given him "carte blanche";
but there may be restrictions
nevertheless.

I heard Petrie give an account,
last week, of his Abydos work,
& saw photographs of the wonderful
gold-work which he found.

No doubt you have seen
these already. What a distance
back, before them, they show,
of technical development.

Petrie says the work is really
finer than that of the later
jewelry.

I hear that Griffith's inaugural
lecture at Oxford was ex-
-cellent. He goes there, to begin
work, in October.

Spiegelberg sends me, now & then,
"Erwiderungen" &c. relating to
his quarrel with C. Schmidt.

That has developed into quite a
