I have been exceedingly regretful that we have left you so long without any news of us, and as you see I am writing you now from New York where I have been held up by a lot of business owing to the depreciation of our dollar and also by persistent recurrences of our old friend, the influenza with whom you are all well acquainted.


I am glad to report that Frances is now much better and is recovering in a sanatorium in Stockbridge, Mass., where she is making excellent progress.

We have been very much distressed to hear of sickness in your household and we now hope that you also are all very much better.

We are of course deeply interested in the great events which are now occurring in Germany. I wish that we might see you all soon again but the depreciation of the dollar increases the cost of European travel on the continent for us by almost a hundred percent and under these circumstances it will be difficult for us to manage another journey.

Be assured that we think of you often and with the same old concern and affection. Charles, Jimmy and Astrid all unite with me in warmest greetings to you all.
