wish you a most pleasant
holiday! I have been
thinking very little (comparatively)
of Egyptology, and find
it altogether delightful to
have a little rest, and
to spend more time with
my wife and the children.
My wife is progressing

rapidly, and seems very well
again now, though she must
not exert herself too much.

I saw Griffith a few weeks
ago: he would very much
like to use your discovery
of ~~my~~ ^{my} ~~of~~ ^{of} which I told him, with
reference to γNH which
(vividly) he explains as $\begin{array}{c} \square \square \text{F} \text{m} \text{m} \text{m} \end{array}$
I have recently found a
variant which seems to
support this view:— Leid I, 369.13
 $\begin{array}{c} \text{F} \text{m} \text{m} \text{m} \end{array}$ Griffith tells me
that $\begin{array}{c} \square \square \end{array}$ was frequently placed
before local names at a late
period: if this is so, his
conjecture might to be a certainty.

I am working over An. 8 and 9
but they are very fragmentary
and I do not know whether
you will be able to use
my transcriptions for the Dictionary.
I should much like to send
them to you when you return
from the Tird; perhaps you
might find time to make a
few suggestions which I could
verify on the originals.
