Dear Professor Eiman

I too was very sorry not to see you before we left Berlin for Finland. Schäfer was also absent at this time, so I found the Museum practically deserted on my return from England.

I have done a considerable amount of work lately. Besides two articles for A. 2, I have been busy writing Zettel, and now send you about 300, including about 170 Zettel from Turin with a good deal of interesting passages, the Leiden Prophet, ten Zettel from Vienna, and 1 a mummy-case in Helsingfors.

I think you will find the text of Leiden I 344 as good as could be

obtained, but I do not think you will care for my translations.

From Vienna I have still a collation of the magical fragment, of one side of the tale fragment, and an unpublished ostraca. These I will verzetteln, if possible, in the next few days.

Of the remaining Turin Pap. there are only the magical texts and the letters, perhaps 200-250 Zettel in all. I wonder if you could inform me whether I have verzettelt Pleyte-Rossi 94-95. If I have, it will be somewhere between Zettel 400 and 480. Perhaps Bureschardt could be so kind as to let me know on a postcard.

I feel rather overworked at present after a very tiring winter, and I must take a holiday, whether I wish it or no. Still I hope to get Turin ready before October, and possibly some other things too. I expect to be the whole of September in Leiden, collating the remaining papyri: but I am not quite sure whether this project will come to anything. At all events I shall be back in Berlin in order to start work with you on October 1.

Your news about the Golenisheff papyri is indeed good. I hope I may still catch a glimpse of them on my return. Could you not prevail upon Golenisheff to let us have photographs at least of the tale. I would gladly pay for the negatives, if I could only be allowed to take them.

I found today, to my dismay, that I have scarcely any Zettel paper left: will you please have some sent to me as soon as possible.

I suppose Burckhardt showed you my Zettel of the Pachel stete. I gave them in just before I left Berlin. It is an important and interesting text.

Here the last weeks have been very hot, but since we have the sea to bathe in, and no thick clothes are needed here, the heat has been rather pleasant than otherwise.

I hope you will have an enjoyable holiday
