### **Brief von Francis LI. Griffith an Adolf Erman**

Dear Sir,

Do you think that it would be desirable as the season for Egypt is drawing near & some Egyptologist may be planning a visit to Siout, to announce that proof of my plates will be ready in October & November & can be supplied to any Egyptologist who intends to visit Siout this winter for 7 shillings.

Also to warn students that no serious work can be done without a light ladder (jointed) 25 feet long -

The inscriptions of Siout & Pifa (9 miles south of Siout) will together fill about 20 plates of convenient size & closely written.


The more doubtful portions are indicated  
as far as possible on the plates. Applications  
for the plates should be made to me at the  
British Museum Bloomsbury London W.C.,

If you think this desirable I should be  
glad if you can find a place in which to  
insert the notice.

P.S. I send one more plate. I verified 33  $\frac{1}{2}$    
(l 248) very carefully. Some portions are doubtful.

On further examination I find that it will  
not be necessary to insert so many of your kind.

be read (pl I l 4) & Demichen must have  
altered it for the sake of the sense, the sign  
being probably too far off to be seen clearly.
