be done with them. It is grievous that

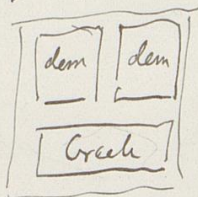
they were so badly treated, for with careful excavation etc they might have been saved, like the huge mass at
