Dear Professor Erman,

The new edition of the Grammar has arrived to my great joy. I have hastily compared it with the old edition and find improvements everywhere; and to have all the new discoveries of yourself and of Sethe systematically set forth will be the greatest help to all of us, beginners and others. I have very much neglected hieroglyphic lately for demotic, and though I am now at work on earlier inscriptions I am longing to return to demotic! Davies has just arrived

here for a few days before starting  
to Egypt to settle the next campaign,  
and at the end of the week I shall  
go to London and see Miss Porter's  
results. I think the work suits her well  
and that she will do it admirably. I am  
very glad indeed that you suggested  
it for her. There is now quite a strong  
company of English Egyptologists. Gardiner  
bids fair soon to be at the head of them.  
Here there is one man (a "freshman" of  
this year) intending to devote himself  
to Egyptology, and he is quite  
promising, being a good draughtsman.

Garstang is to excavate again this year  
and has a small appointment as "Reader"  
in Liverpool. MacIver is working out the  
skull-measurements, but he is away from  
Oxford at present. Greenfell and Hunt  
are performing prodigies in editing  
papyri. Tebtinis I has perhaps reached  
you already.

Please give my kind remembrances  
to Fran Eрман. I trust you yourself  
are well. I think you have let slip very  
few misprints in the Grammatik!
