Dear Frau Erman: - Just a few words to tell you that I have had a safe and happy journey from Cairo via Alexandria and Genoa to Paris, not a hitch in arrangements or disagreeable experience of any kind. My pieces of luggage have not even been opened in any custom house since I left New York, much less have I had duty to pay. I am sailing on the "President Roosevelt" two weeks from today from Havre, France. I intend to divide the time equally between Paris and Germany, going from here either by Sunday night train (April 19) or by Monday aeroplane (April 20). I will let you know later which I do. Whichever way I travel, whether by land or air, I can

take care of myself on
arrival in Berlin. No one
of your family is to try
to meet me. I will com-
municate with you ^{when} once
there. I shall return to Paris
by rail, and I want to go
to Hildesheim and possibly
Hannover on the return
journey. In Berlin I should
like to spend some time in the
Egyptian collection and make
some calls on people I have
long known, but the main
purpose of the visit is to see
you and Professor Erman
at least once again in this
life. The inclosed pictures
will prepare you for the

change in ⁻²⁻ me in "the twenty"
two years since we last
met.
